TIME-CONFLICT POLICY

Please note that, as a general rule of Kobe University, it is not possible to register for courses if classes have time-conflicts (classes with any common meeting time, whether online or on-site, are considered to be time-conflict). However, as an exception to the rule, KIMAP students may be allowed to register for conflicting courses when both of the following conditions are met:

- a) time-conflict takes place between an intensive course and a regular course (Social Science Basic course or KIMAP Elective course);
- b) time-conflicting classes are two meetings or less for each course.

In order to register for an intensive course with time-conflicts, student must submit a request to the academic affairs section of the Graduate School they belong to (please contact your Graduate School for the submission deadline and other details). Note, however, that the Graduate School may reject your request. Seminars are excluded from this time-conflict policy.
